ROAD TRIP

A calculating speed activity

Speed is a measure of how fast something moves, or the distance it moves, in a given amount of time. Speed is calculated by taking the distance traveled and dividing it by time.

Speed = Distance/Time

Speed is not constant. (Think of a runner in a race. At times the runner runs faster and at times the runner is slower.)

Instantaneous speed – the moment to moment speed at each point in time

Average speed – determined by taking the total distance traveled divided by the total time taken.
